Recovery Needs:

The USA estimates the best available data to free wildfire burning, infrastructure economic revitalization, and planning capacity building. A summary of total award needs by category is provided in Table below.

HUD designated three counties as "most impacted and distressed" (MID) in the allocation for the State of New Mexico: Lincoln County, for impacts resulting from DR-4797, and Chisno County, for impacts resulting from DR-4843. The State of New Mexico is required to spend a minimum of 80% of program funding in these three counties due to their MID designation.

In addition to Lincoln County and Chisno County, the State of New Mexico has designated all other FEMA disaster counties for its DR-4799 and DR-4847 as Standardized "most impacted and distressed areas." While total damage estimates are not as high in these areas, there was significant damage to complete and other aspects of vital infrastructure which may require infrastructure assistance through the CDBG-DR program. This adds San Juan County, Rio Arriba County, Santa County, and McKinley Apache Tribe as areas eligible to receive funding. These areas may receive up to 20% of the programmatic funding available through CDBG-DR.

Overall Progress Narrative:

Program Overview

The State of New Mexico received \$137,178,000 in Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds under the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2025, approved on December 21, 2024. These funds support long-term recovery efforts related to the New Mexico South Fork and Salt Fire (DR-4795-NM) and New Mexico Severe Storm and Flooding (DR-4843) disasters, in accordance with Federal Register Notice 90 FR 4759, published on January 16, 2025.

HUD approved the State's Action Plan on August 29, 2025, establishing the framework for implementation of disaster

recovery programs and activities administered by the New Mexico Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM), in coordination with the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA). During the period of April 1, 2026 through June 30, 2026 reporting period, DHSEM continued transitioning from program startup to active implementation across the New Mexico Home Recovery Program and Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program. Program start up activities continue for the Disaster Resiliency Planning Program. Building upon the operational foundation established during the previous quarter, the State focused on expanding program delivery capacity, advancing applicant processing, refining operational procedures, and continuing development of the systems, staffing, and compliance infrastructure necessary to support long-term recovery. During the quarter, DHSEM substantially expanded program staffing by onboarding key leadership and operational personnel supporting housing, assessments, construction, and disaster recovery operations.

Throughout the reporting period, DHSEM continued coordination with local governments, tribal partners, community organizations, and state and federal agencies to ensure implementation remained aligned with the priorities identified through the State's Unmet Needs Assessment and stakeholder engagement process. Recovery investments continued to emphasize housing, infrastructure, and resiliency planning activities serving HUD-designated Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) areas in Chaves and Lincoln Counties, as well as State MID areas in San Juan County, Rio Arriba County, and Mescalero Apache Tribe.

Program Focus During the Reporting Period

During the reporting period, DHSEM focused on expanding operational implementation while continuing to refine policies, procedures, and program delivery systems. Priority activities included advancing applicant intake and processing for the New Mexico Home Recovery Program, opening the Post Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program for proposed project submission, and continuing development of implementation framework for the Disaster Resiliency Planning Program. Implementation efforts during the quarter emphasized operational consistency, quality assurance, regulatory compliance, and readiness to scale program delivery as additional applicants and projects navigate through the recovery process.

New Mexico Home Recovery Program Implementation Progress

The following summarizes high-level implementation progress during the reporting period and is intended to complement activity-level reporting captured in DRGR.

The reporting period marked the New Mexico Home Recovery Program's transition from startup activities to active implementation, with significant progress achieved in staffing, procurement, environmental compliance, applicant processing, and operational readiness. Program activities focused on expanding applicant intake, advancing eligibility review processes, refining damage assessment and environmental review procedures, strengthening operational workflows, and increasing staffing capacity to support long-term program delivery. During the quarter, DHSEM successfully completed the Tier I Environmental Assessments for Lincoln and Chaves Counties, published the associated environmental review documents, notices, and floodplain notices for public comment in accordance with 24 CFR Part 58. Coordination with U.S. Fish and Wildlife and the State Historic Preservation Office continued this quarter. Finalization of the Tier 1 Environmental Review and submission of the Request for Release of Funds is anticipated during the next quarter.

During the quarter, DHSEM onboarded a Construction Supervisor, Assessments Supervisor, and Construction Specialist to support implementation of the Home Recovery Program. Recruitment also continued for a Resident Recovery Services Manager to oversee Intake and Eligibility operations, a Process and Performance Manager to support program optimization and quality assurance, and three finance positions to strengthen fiscal management and grants administration.

Procurement activities also advanced significantly during the reporting period. Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for both Damage Assessment and Construction services were completed and were in the evaluation and review process as of the end of the reporting period, with contract awards anticipated early in the next reporting period. In addition, the Environmental Review Tier 2 services RFP was released during the quarter and scheduled to close in early July 2026. These procurement activities position the New Mexico Home Recovery Program to transition from applicant processing into field implementation and project delivery as environmental reviews, damage assessments, and construction activities commence.

Significant effort was also devoted to developing standardized assessment procedures, environmental review documentation, quality assurance processes, construction oversight frameworks, and cross-functional coordination among housing, environmental review, and construction teams to support efficient project progression and long-term program compliance.

Additional implementation activities included continued refinement of program systems, case management workflows, applicant communications, contractor coordination, and compliance monitoring processes designed to improve consistency and readiness as applicant volume increases.

During the reporting period, the New Mexico Home Recovery Program continued to gain momentum as applicant participation increased across both disaster-impacted counties. Of the 889 households that had submitted an Intent to Apply, including 263 in Lincoln County and 626 in Chaves County, a total of 151 completed applications had been received, representing continued growth from the prior reporting period as of June 29, 2026. Program staff advanced applicants through the initial stages of review, with 141 applications undergoing application review and 10 applications progressing to eligibility review. These activities reflect continued advancement of applicant intake and eligibility processing while establishing the pipeline for subsequent duplication of benefits review environmental compliance, damage assessments, and construction activities.

Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program Implementation Progress

During the reporting period, DHSEM opened the Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program consistent with the phased rollout approach established in the Action Plan. Activities focused on finalizing and publishing program documents for use by eligible entities during the proposal period, conducting community information sessions in all eligible jurisdictions, providing technical assistance as requested by eligible entities interested in submitting project proposals, and further development of operational procedures, proposal evaluation tools, and administrative processes necessary to support future project selection, funding, and monitoring.

During the reporting period, DHSEM published the Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program Guide, Proposal Template and Appendices, Community Information Session slides, and Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA), notifying eligible entities that The New Mexico Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (DHSEM) is accepting project proposals to the Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program from June 15, 2026 through September 13, 2026. Eight Community Information Sessions were facilitated virtually and in person across all eligible jurisdictions.

Significant effort was also devoted to developing standard operating procedures for the Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program during this reporting period, ensuring all procedures are finalized before project selection and award notification after the proposal period closes. Additional implementation activities included continued refinement of program systems, creation of proposal evaluation tools, and planning for implementation of Subgrantee compliance with federal labor standards such as DBRA and Section 3.

Disaster Resiliency Planning Program Implementation Progress

During the reporting period, DHSEM continued planning and program development activities necessary to support future implementation of the Disaster Resiliency Planning Program. Efforts remained focused on establishing administrative frameworks, developing program guidance, and coordinating implementation sequencing with the Home Recovery and Infrastructure Programs. Efforts will be made to open applications in late 2026.

Challenges and Mitigation Efforts

During the reporting period, DHSEM continued addressing implementation challenges associated with transitioning from program startup to active delivery while maintaining compliance with applicable federal requirements.

One of the primary operational challenges involved developing and refining standardized assessment, environmental review, construction management, and quality assurance processes capable of supporting consistent implementation across multiple contractors, disciplines, and program functions. DHSEM addressed these challenges through continued process

refinement, development of comprehensive standard operating procedures, expanded cross-functional coordination, enhanced quality control measures, and ongoing staff and contractor training to promote consistent program administration and regulatory compliance.

Recruitment and workforce development remained an ongoing priority as DHSEM continued expanding organizational capacity to support increasing operational demands. During the reporting period, DHSEM successfully onboarded dedicated supervisory and technical staff supporting assessments and construction activities, significantly strengthening implementation capacity. Recruitment efforts continue for several key management and financial positions, including the Resident Recovery Services Manager, Process and Performance Manager, and three finance positions, to further support program oversight, fiscal management, and long-term operational sustainability.

As applicant processing increased, DHSEM continued refining case management systems, workflow integration, and program coordination across housing, environmental review, construction, finance, and compliance functions. Process improvements implemented during the quarter enhanced operational efficiency, strengthened documentation consistency, and positioned the program for continued scaling as additional applicants advance through eligibility determination, environmental review, and construction activities.

Through these mitigation strategies, DHSEM continued strengthening the administrative, operational, and compliance framework necessary to support successful long-term recovery while advancing implementation of the State's CDBG-DR recovery programs.

Next Steps/Upcoming Activities

During the next reporting period, DHSEM will continue expanding implementation across all three recovery programs while further increasing operational capacity and advancing eligible projects toward completion.

For the New Mexico Home Recovery Program, priorities include executing contracts for assessment and construction management services, completing procurement of environmental review support services, continuing application intake and eligibility determinations, advancing Tier II environmental reviews, conducting damage assessments, developing scopes of work, initiating construction activities for eligible projects, and executing grant agreements for eligible homeowners while continuing to refine program operations based on implementation experience.

For the Post-Disaster Infrastructure Investment Program, DHSEM will provide technical assistance to and answer questions about project proposals from interested eligible entities and continue advancing program readiness by preparing internal processes, creating and finalizing proposal evaluation tools, and identifying State of New Mexico staff to participate in the Program's Evaluation Committee.

For the Disaster Resiliency Planning Program, DHSEM will continue stand up activities in preparation to accept project proposals.

Across all programs, DHSEM will continue expanding staffing capacity, strengthening interagency coordination, refining operational systems and workflows, advancing obligations and expenditures, and maintaining compliance with CDBG-DR requirements while supporting long-term disaster recovery and community resilience throughout New Mexico.

The Mitigation activity encompasses the Mitigation Set-Aside that is specifically designed to target homes located in floodprone areas, wildfire-impacted zones, and other high-risk locations identified through FEMA and state hazard assessments. The Mitigation activity includes mitigation measures (e.g., defensible space for wildfire zones, elevation for flood-prone homes) integrated into the primary rehab/reconstruction scopes of work whenever technically feasible and cost-effective. The objective of the Mitigation Set-Aside is to apply cost-effective, site-specific mitigation strategies during the construction or repair of disaster-damaged homes. These measures are selected based on property location, type of hazard exposure, and feasibility within the scope of the project. All activities funded through the Mitigation Set-Aside must be compliant with HUD requirements and support long-term risk reduction.
